

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH NEWS

As of June 2016, the Winter Park Police Department has 82 officers with 9 officers on duty per shift. The day shift is staffed more heavily when most calls come. WPPD's goal is to respond to emergency calls within 2 minutes, non-emergency calls within 4 minutes.

Winter Park residents should call emergency 911, even for trespass violations. For non-emergency incidents, WPPD will transfer calls to appropriate agencies. Trespassing offenses can become situations that develop into emergencies if not responded to quickly.

Residents should NEVER make contact with suspected trespassers, as this could develop into something more dangerous.

WPPD offers a [S.A.F.E. women's defense class](#), and a free [Security Survey Program](#) and officers will drive-by a property more frequently, when requested.

WPPD's motto is: "**If you see something, say something**". So no matter whether residents call 911, or the non-emergency 644-1313 number, **CALL**.
